TOWN OF LEGAL TRAFFIC BY LAW

A BY - LAW OF THE TOWN OF LEGAL IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, TO
REGULATE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC.

Under the authority and subject to the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act being Chapter M-26.1 of the Revised Statutes of Alberta 1994 and amendments thereto, the Town Council for the Town of Legal, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

PART 1 - DEFINITIONS

101 For the purpose of interpretation, this By-Law accepts and encompasses all definitions as set out in Section 1 of the Highway Traffic Act 1997 and Motor Transport Act 1996 and amendments thereto and all such definitions in that section shall apply to those terms when used in this By-Law.

102 In addition to such definitions as are accepted by Subsection 101, the following definitions shall apply to this By-Law.

- a) "Administrator" means the Administrator of the Town of Legal.
- b) "Council" means the municipal Council of the Town of Legal.
- c) "Commercial Vehicle" means commercial vehicle as defined in the Highway Traffic Act.
- d) "Heavy Vehicle" means a commercial vehicle, public service vehicle, or a truck tractor as defined in the Highway Traffic Act that weighs in excess of 4500 kilograms.
- e) "Holiday" means
 - 1. New Year's Day
 - 2. Family Day
 - 3. Good Friday
 - 4. Easter Monday
 - 5. Victoria Day (the first Monday immediately preceding the 25th day of May in each year)
 - 6. Canada Day
 - 7. Annual Civic Holiday to be proclaimed by the Council and / or by the Mayor (first Monday in August)
 - 8. Labour Day (first Monday in September)
 - 9. Thanksgiving Day (second Monday in October), when proclaimed as a holiday by the government of Alberta
 - 10. Remembrance Day
 - 11. Christmas Day
 - 12. The 26th day of December, or when such day falls on a Sunday, then the 27th day of December, usually known as Boxing Day.

- f) "Passenger loading space" shall mean a space on a portion of a highway designated by the Council and marked by a sign permitting parking therein for the period of loading or unloading passengers, and the said sign shall indicate the time or times when the space is restricted to these purposes.
- g) "Peace Officer" means a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, a Bylaw Enforcement Officer, or Special Constable appointed pursuant to the provision of Section 39 of the Police Act, 1997 Chapter M-26.1, Statutes of Alberta 1994.
- h) Whenever "time" is referred to in this Bylaw it shall mean either Mountain Standard Time Mountain Daylight Saving Time, whichever is proclaimed to be in effect by the Province of Alberta.
- i) "Transit vehicle" means vehicles owned and operated by the Town of Legal which serve passenger public including vehicles operating upon fixed tracks.
- j) "Truck loading and truck unloading space" shall mean a space on a portion of a highway designated by the Council and marked by a sign for the purpose of loading or unloading, permitting truck parking therein for a period as indicated by the said sign. For the purpose of this definition a truck means any vehicle licensed under the Highway Traffic Act as a public service or commercial vehicle.
- k) "Vehicle" means a device in, upon or by which a person or thing may be transported or drawn upon a highway.
- l) "Town" means the Town of Legal in the Province of Alberta.
- m) "Town Foreman" means the Town Foreman of the Town of Legal.

PART 2 - STANDARD VEHICLE PARKING

201 DISTANCE FROM CENTRE LINE

No person shall park a vehicle upon any highway in such a manner that any part of the vehicle is within three (3) meters of the centre line of the highway provided that the foregoing shall only apply to highways where the portion thereof intended for vehicular traffic is twelve (12) meters or more in width.

202 MARKED PARKING SPACE

Where a vehicle parking space upon the highway is designated, an operator using the same space, shall park the vehicle wholly within the limits of the space.

203 PROHIBITED PARKING CONSTRUCTION

(1) No person shall park a vehicle for any period of time whatsoever at the following locations namely:

(a) Upon any portion of a highway adjacent to any structure in the course of erection or repair when such parking will impede or obstruct traffic.

(b) In any truck loading or unloading space marked by a sign indicating the restrictions which apply hereto except a commercial vehicle lawfully engaged in loading or unloading merchandise. Notwithstanding the foregoing, such space may be used for the normal parking of a vehicle on a Sunday or any holiday or at times other than those restricted by the sign.

EMERGENCY DOOR (c) Where the vehicle may in any way interfere with the use of a doorway intended as a fire or emergency exit from any building abutting the highway.

ENTRANCE TO HALL OR HOSPITAL (d) In the entranceway to any fire hall or to any police station or the ambulance entranceway to any hospital.

CERTAIN CLASS OF VEHICLES (e) No person shall park a vehicle at a place or area where the sign indicates that parking ONLY

(f) For the purposes of the foregoing Subsection, the following special classes of vehicles are established:

(i) Small Cars: cars having a wheelbase of Two Hundred and Seventy (270) centimetre or less

- (ii) Police Vehicles
- (iii) Tour Line Buses
- (iv) Funeral Cars
- (v) School Buses
- (vi) Taxicabs

(g) (i) Upon any roadway or alley providing emergency vehicle access to a multiple unit development, emergency vehicles excepted, where such alley or roadway is marked as such by signs on or near alley or roadway.

(ii) In this Section, multiple unit development shall mean a development consisting of two or more self-contained units on a parcel of land in excess of One Thousand (1,000) square meters and without restricting the

generality of the foregoing shall include shopping centres and townhouse developments.

(2) For the purposes of Article 303, the following special classes of vehicles are established as being exempt:

- (i) Emergency vehicles
- (ii) Royal Canadian Mounted Police

204 NO PARKING SNOW REMOVAL OR STREET CLEANING

(1) Notwithstanding any other provision in the Bylaw, the Village Foreman may cause movable signs to be placed on or near a roadway, such signs to read "Emergency - No Parking in this block 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Snow Removal" or "Emergency - No Parking in this block 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. - Snow Removal" or "Emergency - No Parking in this block 10 p.m. to 7 a.m. - Street Cleaning" or "No Parking" signs which are used for roadway maintenance or construction purposes.

(2) No person shall park or leave parked a vehicle on a roadway after expiration of twenty-four hours from the time a sign or signs referred to in article 204 (1) have been placed, and until such signs or signs have been removed.

- (3) (a) When snow removal, street cleaning, roadway maintenance or construction commences any vehicle parked on the signed roadway may be removed pursuant to Section 209(3) hereof
- (b) When it is practical the vehicle, on removal from signed roadway will be left nearby to minimize the inconveniences and expenses to its owner or operator.

205 PASSENGER LOADING

Except when actually taking or discharging passengers, no person shall park a vehicle at the following locations.

- (1) In a passenger loading space marked with a sign.

206 ALLEY

(1) No person shall park a vehicle in an alley unless a sign permits such parking or unless such parking is necessary for the following purposes:

- (a) The loading or unloading of goods from a commercial vehicle for a period not exceeding thirty (30) minutes or

(b) the loading or unloading of goods or passengers from a vehicle other than a commercial vehicle for a period not exceeding five (5) minutes.

(2)Notwithstanding Section (a) and (b) above, no person while loading or unloading passengers or goods shall park a vehicle in such a manner as may obstruct the passage of other vehicles along the alley.

207 TIME RESTRICTED PARKING

(1)Where a traffic control device restricts the parking of vehicles to two (2) hours or less, it shall be an offence to park a vehicle in excess of the time so designated and marked on the traffic control device.

(2)The provisions of this section shall not apply on a holiday.

208 TOWN PROPERTY

No person shall park a vehicle upon any land owned by the Town which the Town uses or permits to be used as a playground, recreation, recreation area or public park, except on such part thereof as the Council may designate by a sign or signs.

209 SNOW ROUTES

(1)No person shall park a vehicle or permit a vehicle to be parked on a highway marked as a snow route.

(2)Subsection (1) applies when the snow route has been declared in effect by the Town Foreman and is in effect for a period of Seventy-two (72) hours unless extended by a further declaration for another Seventy-two (72) hours by the Town Foreman.

(3)All vehicles parked on signed snow routes after declaration indicated in Subsection (2) are subject to immediate removal, at the expense of the registered owner of the said vehicle

210 STORING VEHICLES

(1)No person shall use the highways of the Town for the storing of vehicles thereon.

(a)No person shall use the highway of the Town for the storing of vehicles thereon, this includes all machinery or car dealers etc., while the vehicle or machine is waiting for repairs or is being repaired.

(b)A property owner or tenant may park his vehicle on a highway in the front of his property providing it is parked within the provision of this bylaw,

and not more than seventy two hours without being driven, moved or used. If said vehicle is not moved, it will be towed away at owners expense.

PART 3- SPECIAL CLASSES OF VEHICLES (PARKING AND OTHER REGULATIONS)

301 UNATTACHED TRAILERS

(1)No person shall park any trailer, (whether designated for the carrying of goods and equipment), upon any highway, unless the said trailer is attached to a vehicle by which it may be propelled or drawn, and when so attached the trailer shall be deemed part of the vehicle and subject to the regulations pertaining to vehicles unless otherwise authorized by order of the council.

(2)No person shall occupy or suffer or permit any person to occupy a mobile unit upon a highway or upon public property unless such property has been designated for use as a mobile home or trailer park.

302 ANGLE PARKING OF VEHICLES EXCEEDING 5.8 METERS

No person shall angle park a vehicle which exceeds five point eight (5.8) meters in length upon highway except at such locations as have been designated by the Town Administrator by a sign or in writing.

303 COMMERCIAL/HEAVY VEHICLE PARKING

No person shall park a vehicle or a vehicle with any type of trailer attached thereto upon any highway if the vehicle or vehicle and trailer can be defined as a heavy vehicle or commercial vehicle except when;

(1>Loading or unloading goods to or from premises abutting such highway provided that if the loading or unloading is taking place during a period of restricted visibility, when the vehicle or vehicle and trailer shall have all front and rear parking lights illuminated.

(2)Parked in a designated parking area for a period not exceeding seventy-two (72) hours or time when a traffic control device prohibits.

304 TRACKED VEHICLES

Unless written consent is given by the Town Administrator, no person shall operate on a highway,

(1)A vehicle or trailer having metal spikes, logs or

cleats, or bands projecting from the surface of the wheel or tire of such vehicle, or

- (2) Any vehicle or trailer having skids or not using a triple grouser or flat surface tracks.

305 TRUCK ROUTE

- (1) No person shall operate a commercial or heavy vehicle on a highway other than a highway specified in schedule 1 hereof, except when;

- (a) When delivering or picking up goods from a location
- (b) When mechanical problems dictate

- (2) If deliveries are made off a truck route the operator must use the most direct route to the delivery or pick up location and back again.

306 The following shall not be deemed to be in contravention of Section 305

- (a) Persons driving a public passenger vehicle.
- (b) Persons driving a vehicle that is owned by or actually in the service of the Town and that is actually engaged in work at locations not designated as a truck route.
- (c) Persons specified in the foregoing Subsection must carry and produce upon demand of a Peace Officer proof that the vehicle being driven is actually in the service of the Town.

306 SLOW MOVING VEHICLE

- (1) For the purposes of this Section, slow moving vehicle shall mean a motor vehicle which is required to display an emblem indicating that such vehicle is a slow moving vehicle pursuant to Motor Transport Act Regulation 435/86 or any amendment thereof or any regulation substituted thereof.
- (2) Subject to Subsection (3) below, no person shall operate a slow moving vehicle upon any of the highways referred to in Schedule I between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. or between the hours of 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (3) The provisions of this Section shall not apply to any vehicle owned by or under contract to the Town of Legal or construction equipment with the permission of the Town foreman or any other public utility while such vehicle is

(a) actually engaged in street maintenance operations upon the highways referred to in Schedule 111 hereto, or

(b) travelling to any location for the purposes of carrying out street maintenance operations of an emergency nature.

PART 4 - AUTHORITY OF TOWN ADMINISTRATOR

401 GENERAL

The Town Administrator is hereby delegated the authority to prescribe where traffic control devices are to be located including traffic control devices restricting the speed of vehicles and such traffic control devices located by such persons pursuant to a delegation made under this clause shall be deemed to have been made by Bylaw of the Municipality and to maintain a record of all such locations which shall be open to public inspection during normal business hours.

402 CROSSWALK

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate crosswalks upon any highway and to mark same.

403 NO TURN

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate any highway as a place at which no left hand turn or no right hand turn or both shall be made, and shall cause the said place to be signed, barricaded or otherwise restricted.

404 U-TURNS

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate any intersection or place on a highway, including a place where railway right-of-way crosses a highway, as a place where U-Turns are prohibited and shall cause same to be marked.

405 ONE WAY TRAFFIC

When Town Council has approved of any highway or a part of a highway being designated for one-way traffic and such highway description is recorded in the Town of Legal Sign Ledger, then the Town Administrator shall cause the same to be marked with signage.

406 HIGHWAY CLOSING

The Town Administrator or Town Council can designate any highway as

one which is closed temporarily in whole or in part to traffic, and shall cause said highway to be marked.

407 TRAFFIC LANES

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate any roadway as one to be divided into traffic lanes of such number as the Administrator considers proper.

408 SCHOOL AND PLAYGROUND ZONES

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate, "SCHOOL ZONES", and "PLAYGROUND ZONES". The Town Administrator shall cause such zones to be marked by signs posted along the highway, or by marking the pavement or by signs and lights, or both, posted or suspended over the highway.

409 SPEED LIMIT

When council pursuant to the Town of Legal Traffic Bylaw #01-98, has designated vehicles' speed on a highway or a portion of a highway, then the Town Administrator shall cause such speed limits to be marked.

410 BOULEVARD PARKING

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate any boulevard upon which parking is permitted and shall cause signs permitting such parking to be erected thereon.

411 PASSENGER AND TRUCK LOADING

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate passenger truck loading and unloading spaces and shall cause the same to be marked.

412 BUS STOPS

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate transit zones and shall cause the same to be marked.

413 PARKING TIME LIMITS

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate portions of the highway where parking is limited to a period to time and shall cause signs to be erected indicating such parking limitations.

414 TRUCK ROUTES

When Town Council has approved any highway or part of highway being designated for, "TRUCK ROUTES", and such highway description is recorded in Schedule I of this bylaw the Town Administrator shall cause the same to be marked with signs reading, "TRUCK ROUTE".

415 ANGLE PARKING

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate angle parking on any highway and shall cause the same to be marked.

416 LOAD LIMITS

The Town Administrator or Town Council is hereby authorized in case of unfavourable road conditions, to limit load limits upon town highways.

417 MAXIMUM BRIDGE LOADING

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate the maximum load permitted on any bridge and shall cause same to be marked by a sign.

418 PRIVATE DRIVEWAYS

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to prohibit or restrict by signs the movement of vehicles from a private driveway onto a highway or from a highway onto a private driveway, where such prohibition or restriction is deemed advisable in the public interest and for better regulation of traffic.

419 MEDIANS

The Town Administrator or Town Council is hereby authorized to close any existing median or divider on any municipal highway.

420 BICYCLES

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate locations:

(1) On public roadways where the use of bicycles is prohibited and shall cause same to be marked by signs. Wherever the use of bicycles is prohibited by order of the Town Administrator, a reasonable alternative route shall be provided.

(2) On sidewalks, walkways, and special bicycle paths where the use of bicycles is permitted, and shall cause same to be marked by signs.

421 BICYCLES ONLY

The Town Administrator is hereby authorized to designate portions of highways within the Town for the use of bicycles only and to regulate the movement of bicycles upon the portion of

such highway designated for the use of bicycles.

PART 5 - MISCELLANEOUS

501 LOADING ACROSS SIDEWALK

No person shall load or unload goods or merchandise across a sidewalk or boulevard where loading or unloading facilities have been provided at another area in the premises to which the goods or merchandise are being delivered or from which they are being taken.

502 FIRES

No person shall pass beyond a point designated by a peace officer or a member of the Fire Department near the location of a fire.

503 SKATING

(1) No person shall ice skate, roller skate or skateboard upon a roadway or sidewalk in such a manner as to obstruct pedestrian or vehicular traffic or as to inconvenience any other person on the highway.

(2) No person shall coast on a sled, toboggan, skis, or other conveyance, except a bicycle, upon a highway.

504 NO RIDING ON SIDEWALK

No person shall ride a bicycle having a wheel diameter in excess of fifty-five (55) centimetres on any sidewalk except where permitted to do so by a sign.

505 CONTROL OF HORSE DRAWN VEHICLE

The driver or any other person in charge of any horse-drawn vehicle on a highway shall remain upon such vehicle while it is in motion, or shall remain upon such vehicle while it is in motion, or shall walk beside the horse drawing such vehicle.

506 WASHING VEHICLES

(1) No person shall wash a vehicle upon a roadway or so near a highway as to result in depositing mud or creating slush or ice upon a public sidewalk or roadway.

(2) No person operating a premises with a car wash shall

allow water, mud or slush to deposit on a public sidewalk or roadway.

507SHRUBS/FENCES AT INTERSECTIONS

- (1)No person shall allow trees, hedges, or shrubs on private property to grow to such a height or width that good visibility for safe traffic flow is interfered with.
- (2)The Town Administrator may require any person concerned to comply with the provisions of subsection (1) hereof within 14 days of being notified to do so. If the person fails to comply with such notice, the Town Administrator may direct employees or agents of the Town to enter upon the private property to carry out the necessary work, and may charge the cost of doing so against the person in default.
- (3)No person shall erect or cause to be erected, built or placed, a fence, wall or other object on private property within five (5) meters of a highway intersection, so that good visibility for safe traffic flow is interfered with.

508STREET SIGNS

- (1)No person shall place any sign, notice or structure upon a Town highway or boulevard or upon abutting Town property including public walks unless authorized by Town Council to do so.
- (2)Any sign, notice or other object placed on or beside a Town highway or upon abutting public lands including boulevards and sidewalks, shall be liable for removal and immediate disposal by the Town without any notice or warning to the owner thereof.

509 SNOW, ICE, DIRT AND DEBRIS REMOVAL

- (1)All persons within the Town owning, controlling, or occupying, property that adjoins any sidewalks shall remove or cause to be removed and cleared away all snow, ice, dirt, debris or other materials from that part of any sidewalk adapted to the use of pedestrians, such removal shall be completed within (48) hours of the time when the snow, ice, dirt, debris or other material was formed or deposited thereon. For the purposes of enforcement, there are three separate categories listed as follows:
 - (a)single family property offence,
 - (b)property other than property used for single family residential purposed, first offence, and
 - (c)property other than property used for single family residential purposes, second and

subsequent offences.

- (2) In default of any person complying with subsection (1) above, and in addition to any other remedy available to the Town for non-compliance with this bylaw, the Town may arrange to have the sidewalk cleared and any cost thereof shall be paid to the Town upon demand and failing payment, such cost shall be charged against the property as a special assessment.
- (3) No person shall remove snow, ice, dirt, debris or other materials from any sidewalks by causing such material to be placed upon any other portion of the highway, other public place adjacent to such property, or onto private property other than their own.
- (4) No person shall place or permit to be placed, any snow, ice, dirt, debris or other material removed from the highway or other public places within the Town, onto another highway or other public places within the Town, or onto private property other than their own.

510 ROOFS, EAVES AND AWNINGS

- (1) Every occupant, and in the case there is no occupant, the owner of every house, shop, building, church or chapel abutting on or erected within three (3) meters of any highway or public place shall accumulate on the roof or eaves of such building to an extent that a danger is created to persons passing, cause the same to be removed at once, and every person while removing the same shall take due and proper care and precaution for the warning and safety of persons passing.
- (2) A person who has an awning extending from a portion of his premises over a highway or portion thereof shall keep the awning free from snow or ice.
- (3) If water drips from an awning upon a highway, the owner or occupier of the premises shall clean the sidewalk or roadway portion thereof to prevent ice from forming thereon.

PART 6 - POWERS OF PEACE OFFICERS

601 REMOVAL AND IMPOUNDMENT OF VEHICLE

- (1) Any Peace Officer is hereby authorized to remove or cause to be removed any vehicle or trailer;
 - (a) Parked in contravention of a provision of this Bylaw, or

(b) Parked in contravention of the Highway Traffic Act.

(c) Where emergency conditions may require such removal from a highway. Such vehicle may be removed to a place designated by the Town Administrator where it will remain impounded until claimed by the owner.

602 TRAFFIC TAG

A notice or form commonly called a Traffic Tag having a printed working approved by the Town Administrator or Town Council may be issued by a Peace Officer to any person alleged to have breached any provisions of this bylaw. The said notice shall require forfeiture and payment of the appropriate fine specified for the particular breach of this bylaw as provided in SCHEDULE II attached hereto and declared to be part of this bylaw, to such official as the Town Administrator may designate.

603 TRAFFIC TAG SERVICE

(1) A traffic tag shall be deemed to be sufficiently served;

(a) If served personally on the accused; or

(b) If mailed to the address of the registered owner of the vehicle concerned; or

(c) Is attached to or left on the vehicle in respect of which the offence alleged to have been committed.

604 DUTY TO ENFORCE

Each Peace Officer is hereby charged with the duty of enforcing the provisions of this bylaw.

605 PENALTIES

Any person who commits a breach of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall on conviction for such a breach be liable to a penalty as prescribed in the Town of Legal Bylaws as amended from time to time.

606 ONUS OF PROOF

(1) Where a vehicle is driven, used, parked or left in contravention of any provision of this bylaw, the owner of the vehicle is responsible for the contravention and liable to the penalty provided herein unless he

proves to the satisfaction of the Provincial Judge trying the case, that at the time of the contravention, the vehicle was not driven, used, parked or left by him/her or by any other person with his consent, express or implied.

THIS By-Law rescinds By-Laws No. 155, 159, 278, 310, 30/90, 35/90, 36/91, 02/97 in their entirety and shall come into force upon the passing of the third and final reading thereof.

SCHEDULE I

TRUCK ROUTES

(A) EAST - WEST TRUCK ROUTE

50th Avenue on Secondary Road #651
and
48th Avenue from 50 Street west to 53rd Street

(B) NORTH - SOUTH TRUCK ROUTE

50th Street from North Town Limits to South Town Limits

(C) 52nd street - South of 50th Avenue

DESIGNATED HEAVY VEHICLE PARKING

Heavy vehicle parking allowed only on 52 street from 48 avenue to 50 avenue (M-1 District) and on 48th Avenue as posted.

Heavy vehicle parking limited to two hours during business hours shall be permitted on 50th Avenue from 51 Street east to 46 Street.

SCHEDULE II

SPEED LIMITS:

a) No person shall drive a motor vehicle on any highway within the Town of Legal at a greater speed than 50 kilometres per hour.

b) No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed greater than 30 kilometres per hour in the following school zones:

(1) on 51th Avenue between 46 street and 50 Street.

(2) on 46th Street between 51th Avenue and Chateau Sturgeon Senior Citizen Home.

LANES:

a) No person shall drive a vehicle in any alley within the Town at a speed in excess of 30 kilometres per hour.
